



2018 Wings of Mercy

2018 is coming to a close and we would like to tell you about the patients that were served this past year because of you, our pilots.

By the end of December Wings of Mercy will have flown 51 patients on over 200 missions. Our youngest patient for 2018 was 6 month old Willow TerHorst and the oldest patient was 80 year old Wayne Johnson.

Most of the recipients are fighting cancer or have organ failure and the remainder have immune deficiency, neurological issues, heart disease, diabetes and some are still not diagnosed.

Our patients are siblings like Kolten and Mason Mead; mother and daughter like Beth and Angela Hungerink. Some of them have had a medical issue since birth, like Owen Nichols, and others were given their diagnosis this year like Kohen Karns.

At the end of the day, and at the end of this year, we look back and see the good in all that was done through you, our volunteer pilots. We now look forward to 2019 and the possibility of what we have yet to achieve.
